Carbon tetrachloride is a colorless and inflammable liquid that can be produced by combining carbon disulfide and chlorine. This compound is **widely** used in industry today because of its effectiveness as a solvent as well as its use in the production of propellants.

Despite its widespread use in industry, carbon tetrachloride has been **banned** for home use. In the past, carbon chloride was a common ingredient in cleaning compounds that were used throughout the home, but it was found to be dangerous; when heated, **it** changes into a poisonous gas that can cause severe illness and even death if it is **inhaled**. Because of this dangerous characteristic, the United States **revoked** permission for the home use of carbon tetrachloride in 1970. The United States has taken similar action with various other chemical compounds.
